From Travis

I planted a couple of grapevines in my yard a few years ago (I reckoned as a preacher ought to have one). My gardening bible (Garden Primer by Barbara Damrosch) suggested I plant the vines between two poles fifteen feet apart. On the poles, I placed two wires perpendicular to the ground so I could train the vines on. Now here is why I am mentioning this: the wires were attached to the poles with eye screws. The idea is that once the wires sag, I can tighten the eye screws and thus tighten the wires.

We are now into week 12 of suspended in-person worship service, and if we are not careful, I can see the wire will start to sag. Right now, there is sagging. We continue to have over 200 households reading the Judson Connections emails; we continue to gain new likes via Facebook (over 350 now). We continue to have more people watching our Sunday services online than we had attending in-person worship on Sunday mornings. People are attending Adult Education, committee meetings, and informal check-ins via zoom, over 100 people voted for the roof repair/solar panels (over 100 people!), and financial giving is consistent. Two members joined the church, and we have raised over \$11,000 for the Judson Fund. But after 12 weeks we are all experiencing "zoom fatigue," we all want to see one another, we want to hug someone, and just be present with each other.

I wish I could say in just a little while we'll be back to normal. But you and I know that will not be the case. I do not know when we will start the process of holding in-person worship services. When we do, it will be a slow process; we will start with small groups and slowly expand.

We will keep the wire taut by doing a few things differently and lots of things the same. Call someone new this week. Pick someone in the directory and send a postcard. Record yourself saying hello and send it to me so I can include it during our Sunday worship services. Join the Judson summer reads online book group, first book The Universal Christ by Richard Rohr. Invite a few people to join you for a zoom happy hour with no agenda other than to say hello, I miss you, and it is good to see you.

We will make it through this time together. We will continue to reach out to others; we will continue to lean in with curiosity; we will continue our holy work of loving God, our neighbor, creation, and ourselves. Light a candle, say a prayer, take a deep breath, and know for certain God loves you, Judson Church loves you, and I love you.

MODERATORS LETTER

Dear Judsonites,

When the Judson Council voted in mid-March to suspend large non-essential gatherings in the church, I was not sure how we would respond. Would we slowly drift apart, or would we remain a connected, committed community? I am not aware of a set of attributes that describe a committed community during a quarantine, but here are some things that I observe:

- The daily emails from Travis have been a strong point of connection for me. They come at the end of the day when I am in a mood to reflect on my day. They are sweet, supportive, and recognize that these are tough times. As I read and listen to them, I think of you.
- The Sunday morning services create a rich opportunity to join in a weekly ritual that otherwise would be missing. Thanks to the regular appearance of Travis, Polly, Carolyn, Jim W., John, Eileen, Jim T., and the occasional appearances of many other Judson members, we are being served with a meaningful visual, auditory, emotional, and spiritual experience. Sunday morning at our house has become a sacred time—Pam and I settle in on the couch after breakfast with our coffee (me) and tea (Pam), light a candle, and "go to church," envisioning that we are all doing the same thing at the same time. We continue to look forward to the day when we can again gather at Judson.
- By any reasonable measurement during this time, the 2020-2021 stewardship campaign was a huge success, raising over \$211,000 in pledged giving. Thanks to the MLS committee members for their work. And thanks to all who support the ministry of Judson. Whether it is monetarily or some other form of a spiritual gift.
- More than \$10,000 has been given to the newly formed Judson Fund, specifically created to provide help to Judson members who are experiencing financial issues during this time.
- Two people have officially become members of Judson during our suspension! Please welcome Beverly Bockus and Margo Willett. Their decisions to join at this time give me great hope.
- The ongoing work of the Congregational Care Committee has been a source of love and comfort to many among us. Their work often goes unnoticed by the majority but is extremely important to those in need of support by their faith community.
- Adult Ed has conducted several Sunday afternoon on-line gatherings covering the specific topics of gratitude and humility as well as providing a safe space for expressing our personal response to the implications of the epidemic.
- The Finance Committee and Property Committee continue to do their important maintenance work so that the church is taken care of physically.
- Many of you are continuing your personal ministry in ways of which I am unaware—connecting with others in ways that say "you are loved." Thanks for your consistency.
- Finally, for the first time that I am aware of, Judson conducted a mail-in ballot to decide a major initiative. I am speaking, of course, about the project to replace the flat roof over the Judson Preschool and to install solar panels on the Judson roof. More details will be furnished in a Judson News Flash in the next few days, but we can now report the following:
 - ♦ Over 60 percent of Judson's eligible voting members cast a vote. When was the last time we had 60% of our voting members at a business meeting? Maybe when we called Travis.
 - ♦ The vote was nearly unanimous in favor of replacing the roof and installing solar panels! Look for more news about this in the coming weeks and months.

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Given the significant size of the response and our uncertainty about when we can once again gather at Judson, we may want to consider using the mail-in ballot approach for reaching decisions on other upcoming decisions such as the 2020-2021 Judson officer and committee slate and the 2020-2021 Judson budget.

So, there is a lot to be thankful for, as well as significant support for believing that Judson remains a strong community. But no matter how one looks at it, each and every one of you is the key ingredient in making all of the above happen. Your hands, your hearts, your gifts of many kinds, your hopes, and your doubts all make Judson work. Thanks to all of you.

houses we pass on our walks.






