MODERATOR'S LETTER

It helps to know you're not alone. We are all sick and tired of the stress and anxiety brought on by the pandemic. We're going into the darkest part of the year. The news is mostly bad and depressing. I was reading through some of my paperwork and found Brad Joern's "Short and Long-term Goals for Judson." First on the list was "Help the congregation heal from the lingering effects of COVID, racial unrest, and other oppressive/depressive forces at work."

How do we do that? I attended the anxiety workshop put on by Joel Frederickson and actually remember some of it. The words "curiosity" and "kindness" stand out. Curiosity: rather than obsessing with something, repeating the loop over and over, we ask ourselves a question. For example, instead of stressing out over how crowded the post office will be, ask yourself, "What interesting conversations might I have with the clerk or other customers? How can I start one?" Kindness: don't beat yourself up. Recognize that these really are tough times and that you need to be kind to *yourself*.

Of course, sometimes we get snapped out of our funks in unexpected ways. Like recognizing the twinkling eyes of Shirley Doyle in the checkout lane at the Co-op and imagining her infectious smile under that mask. Recognize those

moments. I feel better already!

COVID TASK FORCE UPDATE

COVID GUIDELINES FOR JUDSON WORSHIP and other large gatherings, such as concerts

January 2022

1. As the signs posted on the Judson Church entrances state...

If you have any of these symptoms, go home, stay away from other people, and contact your health care provider: Fever or feeling feverish; Chills; A new cough; Shortness of breath; A new sore throat; New muscle aches; New headache; New loss of smell or taste.

- 2. Masks are required at worship services and other large gatherings at Judson.
- 3. Worship and event leaders (Travis, Carolyn, worship leaders, musicians) will wear masks, but may temporarily remove them when speaking / performing.
- 4. We encourage people to fellowship outside after the service / event.
- 5. The first few pews will remain vacant. The sanctuary remains marked for social distancing, with alternate pews roped off.
- 6. Adjustments so far have worked well, and will continue: using the small individual containers for communion; the practice of shared prayer requests; one offering basket in the back; masks and hand sanitizers available at several spots.
- 7. We are thankful that the vast majority of Judson people have been vaccinated; we continue to strongly encourage getting vaccinations.
- 8. Continue to check Judson emails for ongoing updates and reminders. We will continue to be cautious and flexible at Judson.

Below are additional general points related to use of Judson at other times.

- 1. Wear masks upon entering and exiting the church. Be especially mindful of this when preschool children are present.
- 2. Each small group meeting at church can use its judgment as to whether to continue to wear masks during that meeting.
- 3. We continue to strongly recommend getting vaccinations.

Create a task force to study, evaluate, and recommend modifications to make the exterior of Judson more informative and more inviting.


3-5 people perform a 2-3 month study

Look at entryways, signage, informational boards, lighting, grounds, etc. Compare to other churches and gathering places.

Possible questions to ask:

- How easy is it for me to know how to get in the building? What if I am handicapped?
- Are the entrances inviting? Well lit? Easy to recognize and open?
- Is the signage clear and visible from the street? Is it attractive? What is missing?
- What else could cause people to stop and engage?
- Does the exterior adequately reflect our Judson Invitation of "Bring your hopes. Bring your doubts. Feed your soul."?
- What improvements could be made to the playground?
- What improvements/changes would you recommend?
- Large or small?
- Short-term or long-term?
- Easy or hard?
- How could the wider community be involved?
- In the study?
- In the solutions?

RACIAL JUSTICE TEAM WINTER SCHOOL

<u>Tuesday, January 18th 7 PM – Blood Memory.</u> This video is about North America's Indian Adoption Era when nearly one-third of Native children were removed and placed in white homes. The video exposes underlying issues and refers to modern-day cultural issues of suicide, split families, separated families, found families, early death... all so real and not "fiction" in the reservation communities. How can we as a viewing group pay close attention to, and learn from the mention of these issues? The video shows "other ways of knowing" such as the vision or memory that shows up in the sweat. Some take it seriously, some don't. Do we? How would we be different if we really believed that visions could come to us through ceremony or a sweat lodge? How can we show the deepest respect for this other way?

<u>Tuesday, February 15th 7 PM - Slavery By Another Name.</u> This is a 90-minute documentary that challenges one of Americans' most cherished assumptions: the belief that slavery in this country ended with the Emancipation Proclamation.

<u>Tuesday, March 15th 7 PM – Freedom Summer.</u> In 1964, a new plan was hatched by Bob Moses, a local secretary for the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee. For ten weeks, white students from the North would join activists on the ground for a massive effort that would do what had been impossible so far: force the media and the country to take notice of the shocking violence and massive injustice taking place in Mississippi.

SOLAR PERFORMANCE FROM 10/18/21 TO 11/16/21 (29-DAY PERIOD)

Listed below is the Judson solar system performance from our December Xcel bill that covers the 29-day period from 10/18 to 11/16.

Our solar system, as of Dec 20, 2021 has generated just shy of 49,000 kWh since last spring's activation on April 29th. Maybe more importantly we have also saved almost 36 tons of CO₂ emission!!

Solar Electricity Generated during period = 3,199 kWh Electricity Used by Judson during period = 6,720 kWh Electricity Used by Judson from Solar during period = 960 kWh Solar Electricity put back on grid during period = 2,239kWh Solar Credit for 32-day period = ——— Xcel Bill (includes Credit) for 32-day period = \$1187.73 Xcel Bill from last year's November bill = \$1525.83
