A Note on Communication:



# THE GATHERING: OPENINGS NOW

There are now openings for new participants at THE GATHERING. This spring, we restarted in -person gatherings at Bethlehem Lutheran Church (41st and Lyndale). If you or someone you know has moderate memory loss, consider joining us on the first and third Thursdays each month. Call Mary at 612-243-4591 for details about participation, or contact Kathy or Wayne Urbaniak for more information. You can also arrange to visit for one day to see if The Gathering is a good fit.

THE GATHERING is a joint ministry (Judson and Bethlehem) that provides service and care to people with moderate memory loss and gives time to their caregivers. Participants gather at Bethlehem Church; each has a 1:1 volunteer for the day (10:00-3:00). In this way, participants' caregivers are given 5 hours of "time off," knowing their loved ones are at in an enjoyable and safe setting for the day.

Each day has a different theme: short presentations, hands-on activities, music therapy, lunch, and videos tied in with the topic. Co-leaders organize the day, and a volunteer is paired with each participant for the whole day. At the May 19 session, our theme was "Chocolate"—lots of fun (and sampling). Here is the upcoming schedule: Classic Toys, June 2; New York City, June 16; Circus, July 7; Photography, July 21.

## BOOTLEG COUNCIL REPORT\*

Judson Council met on May 3, 2022. Here are some highlights:

A thorough presentation and discussion of the proposed 2022-2023 budget resulted in the Council approving the budget proposed by the Finance Committee. The proposed budget has a \$14,000 deficit, but the church has income from dedicated accounts that can cover the deficit.

- Council passed a motion to approve the committee chairs and officers for next year's Council. We still need chairs for Missions, Congregational Care (winter months), and Worship.
- Concerns voiced regarding congregational care: needs are changing and will need to be addressed.
- Thanks to Keith Ford and Luise Forseth for their excellent work on Council.

# CONGREGATIONAL CARE, 2022-2023

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you fulfill the law of Christ. Galatians 6:2

People of Judson care for one another—love each other and bear one another's burdens —through their interactions and relationships. We are thankful for this; we acknowledge it (without knowing the many details); we encourage these caring attitudes and acts to continue on personal levels.

The Congregational Care Committee is one method by which Judson Church communicates, supports, and cares for one another. Here is the "Committee Description" for Congregational Care, from August 1, 2021:

The Congregational Care Committee's purpose is to alert the congregation, through the Tree of Life, about members, friends, or relatives who need our thoughts, prayers, and personal contact. Congregational members volunteer in adjunct ways. Essential tasks are praying, visiting, telephoning, writing notes, and sending cards. We also find volunteers to help for one-time purposes.

Congregational Care is organizing its service in 4-month segments for this new church year: June-September, October-January, and February-May.

People are agreeing to serve during one or more of those segments by meeting via zoom for one hour once per month—to share updates on our connections within our community. All of us, at various times, need special care from our congregation.

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#### THE FUN FAIR WAS A GREAT SUCCESS!

Goals: We had three:

- 1. Build and strengthen our Judson Community
- 2. Raise funds for our operations and outreach programs
- 3. Have fun accomplishing the above

We believe we have done all the above and raised over \$7000 (we'll soon know the actual number). Also, many Great Gatherings events happening soon will help us all have a good time while reconnecting.

#### **Building Community**

Our Marketing & Communications person, Bryant Kumlin, told me that we had 40 more YouTube views than we usually get, and 300 more people reached than normal by a Facebook post. That is about a 100% increase over average across all platforms. We cannot know who exactly viewed our post. In total, we had 84 views of our virtual program, 300 views of our website over 3 days versus 30 on average, and the Facebook event reached 455 people. The auction drew a bigger crowd than the video of our program. Also, because we opened up some items for bidding to the entire "Bidding for Good" virtual auction population, we had 7 items that were purchased from people in other states who were not from Judson. We likely had a few neighbors check us out as well. So, because of the wonderful program that Polly and Doug Weatherhead pulled together, the colorful poster and information that Doug Harvey created for all of us, Bryant's work to post ads on Southwest Voices and on Facebook, Eileen's communications, and everyone's emails, and also Diane Kolodziej and her brother who posted flyers at local businesses, "All of that leads me to the conclusion that there are now more people in the world who know about Judson, and who learned about the work we do here than there were prior to the Fun Fair."
